

Summary of Inspection Findings 2021-2022



Himayah School for Girls' Education opened in 2018. It offers the curriculum of the Ministry of Education (MoE) to students from the Grades 1 to Grades 11. The school is located on Al Karama. At the time of its first inspection in February 2022, it had 1040 students present in the school.



The principal, Ms. Safiya Al Mansoori, joined the school at the time of the inspection visit. She is the school's third principal. There have been no new teachers during the year.



The school provides an acceptable quality of education for its students. This does not yet meet the expectations of the UAE. The school's leaders are committed and loyal, but the skills and capacity of some are limited. Overall, leadership does not have a reliable understanding of how students learn best.



Acceptable progress for students is made in almost all subjects except in Islamic Education, where it is good. Progress is also good in English in Cycle 1. Learning skills are acceptable but students of determination do not receive the care and support to help them to make good levels of progress. Various forms of technology support student learning.



The school offers a safe and caring environment for all. Parents are welcomed to the school and play an important part in the community and their children's education. Strong relationship exists among teachers and students. Teachers provide helpful guidance in supporting older students to make decisions about their next stages of learning.

The next steps for the school are to ensure that:



- leaders establish a thorough self-evaluation processes
- teaching and assessment systems measure more accurately student progress
- specialist leaders are appointed for inclusion and academic subjects
- governance holds leaders to account for the school's performance and the correct identification and support for students of determination.
