

Summary of Inspection Findings 2021-2022



DEWA Academy opened its doors in 2013, offering a curriculum that combined the general curriculum stream of the Ministry of Education (MoE) alongside a full BTEC engineering course. At the time of inspection, the academy, located in Al Hudaiba, had 199 Emirati boys from Grade 10 to 12. The school was inspected in February 2022; this was the first inspection since the school opened.



The academy leader, Mr. Khalid Mohd Masood Bin Masood was the founding director when the academy first opened. The academy has a very low rate of staff turnover, typically less than 10% annually.



The school provides a 'Good' quality of education to its students. This means that it meets the expectations of the UAE. The governing body, director and senior leaders deliver a pioneering, innovative and highly successful vocational provision for Emirati boys. Most students, following graduation, go on to take up a position as an engineering technician in the DEWA organisation. The highest achieving students are offered a scholarship to continue their education, with a view to graduating as an engineer, and take up a more senior position in the company.



Students make good progress in almost all subjects except in Arabic. Students with mild to moderate learning difficulties are mostly well supported. Students and teachers use mechanical and electronic engineering resources, and technology well to make learning relevant and interesting.



The academy offers high standards of safety and security. Students are encouraged to conduct themselves as mature, young adults, which they do, and to make safe and healthy life choices. The relationships between the academy and local families are very strong and parents are an important part of the educational community. The KHDA Students' Wellbeing Census results for this school shows that students' level of happiness is in line with that of other students in Dubai private schools. This reflects what was seen and heard by inspectors during the inspection.

The next steps for the school are to ensure that:



- Teachers plan more effectively to promote learning skills such as problem solving and critical thinking
- All leaders are involved in accurate self-evaluation and the development of comprehensive improvement plans
- Standards of attainment in all subjects, and especially in Arabic, are improved further
