

Summary of Inspection Findings 2021-2022



Himayah School for Education Boys (Abu Hail) opened in 2018. It offers the UAE Ministry of Education (MoE) Curriculum for boys from Grade 1 to Grade 11. It is located in Deira, Dubai. At the time of its first inspection, in February 2022, it had 1042 students.



Mr. Jamal Hassan Abdullah Al Sheba joined the school in 2019 and is the second principal of the school. There have been no changes in the teaching staff during the 2021-2022 academic year.



The school leadership manages the school to an acceptable level and has established a culture based on discipline, citizenship and Islamic values. Most leaders understand how children learn and are developing teaching strategies to help them to improve further.



Students make acceptable progress in almost all subjects in Cycles 1 and 2. The progress of students in Cycle 3 is good in most subjects. Students of determination are supported by class teachers but there are no specialist teachers to support their needs further. Technology is used well to make learning interesting. Students take part in a variety of organised competitions and activities. They take an active part in the community and with environmental and charity schemes.



The school provides an acceptable quality of care, support and safety for students and staff. Parents are welcomed to the school and play an important part within the educational community. The KHDA Students' Well-being Census results for this school shows that students' level of happiness is that of other students in private schools in Dubai. In discussions, students confirm that they are happy and proud to be at the school.

The next steps for the school are to ensure that:



- the educational leadership of the school is more effective
- all the subjects are covered as expected by the Ministry of Education (MoE)
- teaching and assessment are developed further, and
- the safety equipment in the laboratories and on the school buses are improved and regularly maintained.
