

Summary of Inspection Findings 2021-2022



The Dubai Heights Academy opened in 2017. It offers the National Curriculum for England to boys and girls from the Foundation Stage to Year 8. It is located in Al Barsha 2 South, Dubai. At the time of inspection, it had 240 students from FS1 to Year 8. The school was inspected in March 2022; this was the first inspection since the school opened.



The Principal, Alison Lamb, joined the school in 2019 and is the second principal appointed since the school opened. No teachers left during the 2021-2022 academic year.



The school provides a 'Good' quality of education to its students. This means that it meets the expectations of the UAE. The principal and senior leaders have inspired other leaders with a compelling vision and have established a culture based on strong inclusive values. Most leaders in the school have a very good understanding of how children learn, and how teachers can teach best.



Students make good progress in almost all subjects except in Arabic and Islamic Education and Phase 3 science. Students of determination are well supported and make good progress. Students and teachers use technology well to make learning interesting. Students take part in a variety of after-school activities.



The school offers very high standards of care, and the premises are clean and spacious. Parents feel very welcome at the school and are an important part of the educational community. The KHDA Students' Wellbeing Census results for this school shows that students' level of happiness is in line with that of other students in Dubai's private schools.



The next steps for the school are to ensure that:

- students improve their levels of achievement in Islamic Education, and Arabic;
- all teachers make good use of assessment outcomes to plan lessons that more effectively address the learning needs of all students and
- the curriculum is modified effectively to meet the needs of all students, especially the most able.
