

Summary of Inspection Findings 2021-2022



The Aquila School opened in 2018. It offers the National Curriculum for England to boys and girls from Foundation Stage (FS) to Year 9. It is located in Dubailand. At the time of the inspection, it had 854 students on roll. The school was inspected in March 2022. This was the first inspection since the school opened.



Mr Wayne Howsen joined the school as principal in January 2018, several months before the school opened. Around 10% of teachers changed during the 2021-2022 academic year.



The school provides a good quality of education for its students. The principal and senior leaders lead by example and have been successful in creating a climate for learning and an ethos of mutual respect. Senior leaders have a clear understanding of how teachers can promote rapid progress in students. Governors and senior leaders do not offer sufficient responsibility or scope to middle leaders to enable them to develop their capacity to perform key roles, for example in school self-evaluation.



Students make good progress in all subjects. Students of determination are supported appropriately. They make acceptable progress. Students and teachers do not use technology consistently in classes to support or extend learning. Research skills are not systematically developed as students progress through the school. A structured programme of curriculum review ensures relevance, continuity and breadth for students.



The school offers high standards of care and security for students and staff. The premises are very well maintained. Parents report high levels of satisfaction with the school. They feel that staff are accessible and responsive. They highly value the school's ethos of mutual respect. The well-being census shows that students' level of happiness is broadly in line with that of other students in Dubai private schools. Students report that bullying is rare in the school.

The next steps for the school are to ensure that:



- attainment is raised for all subjects, especially for Arabic;
- students have more opportunities to use technology to support and extend their learning and
- middle leaders are enabled to build their capacity to lead, for example in the context of school self-evaluation.
